



Bylaws of the Rawlins Wyo Outlaw Jeep Club

Article I – Name

The name of this organization shall be the Rawlins Wyo Outlaw Jeep Club, hereinafter referred to as "the Club."

Article II – Purpose

The purpose of the Club is to:

1. Promote safe and responsible off-road recreation in and around Rawlins, Wyoming.
2. Encourage fellowship among Jeep and off-road vehicle enthusiasts.
3. Support the principles of Tread Lightly! and respect for the environment, landowners, and other trail users.
4. Organize group trail rides, events, and community service activities that benefit both Club members and the community.

Article III – Membership

1. Eligibility: Membership is open to any individual who owns or operates a Jeep or other off-road-capable vehicle and supports the objectives of the Club.
2. Dues: Annual membership dues are \$10 per individual, payable at the beginning of each calendar year.
3. Good Standing: Members in good standing are those who have paid their dues and abide by the Club's Code of Conduct.
4. Termination: Membership may be suspended or revoked by a majority vote of the officers for failure to uphold the Code of Conduct or for conduct deemed detrimental to the Club.

Article IV – Officers

1. Elected Officers: President, Vice President, and Secretary/Treasurer.
2. Duties:
 - President: Presides over meetings, represents the Club in official matters, and oversees operations.
 - Vice President: Assists the President and assumes duties in their absence.
 - Secretary/Treasurer: Maintains records, minutes, membership lists, and manages all financial transactions.
3. Elections: Officers shall be elected annually by a majority vote of members present at the first meeting of the year.
4. Vacancies: Vacancies may be filled by appointment of the President with approval of the remaining officers.

Article V – Meetings

1. Regular Meetings: The Club shall meet quarterly or as needed, at a time and place designated by the officers.
2. Special Meetings: May be called by the President or by a majority of the officers when necessary.
3. Quorum: A simple majority of members present shall constitute a quorum for conducting official business.
4. Voting: Decisions shall be made by majority vote of members present.

Article VI – Code of Conduct

All members agree to:

1. Operate their vehicles safely and responsibly at all times.
2. Show respect to fellow members, the public, and the environment.
3. Follow the Tread Lightly! principles: travel responsibly, respect the rights of others, educate yourself, avoid sensitive areas, and do your part.
4. Refrain from any illegal or reckless activity while representing the Club.
5. Promote a positive image of the off-road community.

Article VII – Finances

1. All funds shall be deposited into an account in the Club's name and managed by the Secretary/Treasurer.
2. Expenditures must be approved by a majority of officers.
3. The Treasurer shall present a brief financial report at each regular meeting.



Article VIII – Amendments

These bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at any regular meeting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been given at least one meeting prior.

Article IX – Dissolution

In the event of dissolution, any remaining Club funds shall be donated to a local charity or off-road conservation organization, as determined by a majority of the remaining members.

Appendix A – Tread Lightly! Principles

T – Travel Responsibly

Stay on designated roads, trails, and areas. Avoid creating new tracks or widening existing ones. Cross streams only at designated fording points. Respect private property and avoid trespassing.

R – Respect the Rights of Others

Be considerate of other recreationists — both motorized and non-motorized. Yield the right of way to hikers, bikers, and horseback riders. Keep noise levels down and respect trail and area closures.

E – Educate Yourself

Know the rules and regulations for the area you're visiting. Get proper training for vehicle recovery and safe off-road driving. Carry maps, tools, and emergency supplies. Know your vehicle's capabilities.

A – Avoid Sensitive Areas

Stay away from meadows, wetlands, and wildlife habitats. Don't disturb historical, cultural, or archaeological sites. Avoid riding or driving on muddy trails that can cause long-term damage.

D – Do Your Part

Always pack out what you pack in. Volunteer for trail maintenance or cleanup events. Properly dispose of waste and garbage. Set an example by following and promoting responsible recreation.
